## **MOTION 1: Supporting our veterans**

"This Council continues to recognise the need to support Veterans as a way of repaying our national heroes once they leave the armed forces. It also acknowledges the leadership of Boris Johnson's Government in creating the first ever Office for Veterans. This Council notes that all the councils in Hertfordshire are signed up to the Armed Forces Covenant and Hertsmere has a representative on the covenant board.

- 1. This Council is committed to supporting our Veterans in all walks of life and will continually seek new and inventive ways to recognise and honour their service. This commitment will allow the Council to use its position to help work with and influence other organisations and private sector companies to offer Veterans similar recognition and support.
- 2. The Authority will continue in all its operations to offer Veterans the added support via our representative on the Armed Forces Covenant Board
- 3. While this Council already recognises the devastating impact of homelessness, we are pleased to note Hertsmere's housing allocations policy makes provision for supporting veterans and in particular waiving the local connection provisions in accordance with regulations set out in 2012. We should also seek to assist in the rehabilitation of local veterans currently in UK prisons and assist with rehousing on their release.
- 4. This council recognises the special rates offered by the local leisure trust InspireAII to encourage use of the facilities which assists with Veterans' physical and mental well-being and would urge other business where possible to offer Veterans discounted rates.

We would like to see the council build on this online presence recognising the Hertfordshire Hero's website is the county wide agreed source for information, advice and planned events and commemoration activities.
